

# Jury pleases both sides

KERRVILLE - Seven women and five men have been chosen to decide the fate of Darlie Routier, the Rowlett woman accused of killing two of her children.

"I think we've got a good, solid jury," said defense attorney Richard Mosty. "I'm pleased with the way it's turned out. The people we have are open-minded, objective and they're going to require the state to prove its case."

Assistant District Attorney Greg Davis said prosecutors also are pleased with the jury selection.

Routier, 26, is charged with fatally stabbing two of her young sons, Damon, 5, and Devon, 6, in their living room June 6. She told police that an intruder broke into the home and killed the boys before attacking her with a knife and then fleeing.

Testimony is to begin Jan. 6 in Kerrville. The case was moved from the Dallas area in September.
